Effective July 4, 2021

Background

- 1. This Addendum replaces the previous Addendum issued effective 6pm July 2, 2021.
- 2. The purpose of this Addendum is to provide additional information to support the individual Racing Code Protocols following the announcement by the Queensland Government in relation to the lockdown.
- 3. The lockdown ceased at 6pm July 3, 2021 for the Local Government Areas of Brisbane and Moreton Bay.
- 4. The lockdown ceased at 6pm July 2, 2021 for the Local Government Areas of Ipswich, Logan City, Redlands, Sunshine Coast, Noosa, Somerset, Lockyer Valley, Scenic Rim, Gold Coast, Townsville (including Magnetic Island) and Palm Island.
- 5. The LGAs referred to in points 3 and 4 above are considered "impacted areas".
- 6. These restrictions apply predominantly to race meetings conducted within the impacted areas, but some (such as the wearing of face masks) will apply in part to all race meetings throughout the State.
- 7. It is expected that these restrictions will be in place until 6pm July 16, 2021.

Race meetings

- 8. All race meetings will return to normal with Patrons again able to attend all race meetings throughout the State.
- 9. All persons attending race meetings in the impacted areas must comply with all Queensland Health directions.

Face masks

- 10. At race meetings in the impacted areas (i.e., those LGAs that were under lockdown):
 - (a) Essential Racing Personnel: are required to wear a face mask at all times including indoors, stabling/kennelling areas, in mounting yards, behind barriers, starting boxes etc. Jockeys and drivers are not required to wear a face mask whilst racing but must wear a face mask at all other times.
 - (b) Patrons: are required to wear a face mask at all times, except when eating or drinking.
- 11. At race meetings in unimpacted areas (i.e., the rest of Queensland):
 - (a) Essential Racing Personnel: are required to wear a face mask in the Core Racing Areas including indoors, stabling/kennelling areas, in mounting yards, behind barriers, starting boxes etc. Jockeys and drivers are not required to wear a face mask whilst racing but must wear a face mask at all other times in Core Racing Areas.
 - (b) Patrons: are not required to wear a face mask.

Core Racing Area access

12. Owners are permitted access to Core Racing Areas at all race meetings across the state but must wear a face mask.

Occupant Density

- 13. Racing clubs in the impacted areas are reminded of amended occupant density requirements, specifically how they will relate to rooms/areas used by Essential Racing Personnel. The requirements are one person per 4m² for larger rooms inside and one person per 2m² outdoors, while smaller venues up to 200m² are allowed one person per 2m² with a maximum of 50 people.
- 14. Racing clubs in the impacted areas are also required to follow the requirement for seated eating and drinking.

Temperature testing on arrival

15. Temperature testing of Essential Racing Personnel on arrival at all TAB race meetings across Queensland has been reintroduced and will continue during this period.

Training venues and stables/kennels

16. All persons attending training venues and stables/kennels for trackwork/trials/jumpouts within the impacted areas must wear a face mask.

Contact tracing alerts

17. Queensland has current contact tracing alerts and related public health advice. All race clubs and Essential Racing Personnel are advised to refer to the following link, which contains a list of venues for contact tracing. All parties are reminded of their obligations and requirements if they have been to any of the venues on the dates and times specified.
